- Level 4 apprenticeship, working towards an HNC in Construction and the Built Environment, beginning your journey towards achieving membership of a professional body (CIAT, CIOB)

- Two-three year programme (plus 6 months End Point Assessment) with a potential full-time role at the end or the chance to join the level 6 apprenticeship
- A carefully planned combination of practical work and study
- Open to all ages, but you will need:
 - A minimum of five GCSEs (or equivalent, e.g. O-levels) including Maths and English at grades 9-4 (A*-C)
 - Have an A Level DD, BTEC National Diploma PPP or, Access to HE Diploma with 21 Merits or a Level 3 Apprenticeship in a related subject
 - A genuine interest in construction and the built environment
 - To be organised and methodical
 - To be willing to travel overseas as part of your apprenticeship
 - British citizenship, having lived in the UK for the last three years before the first day of the apprenticeship and for at least five of the last ten years
 - To be at least 16 years old by 1 July 2024 so you can complete Security Check (SC) clearance before your start date
- Candidates will need to undergo Security Check (SC) clearance before joining, and Developed Vetting (DV) clearance after joining







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YOUR PROGRAMME

If your application is successful, you'll begin your apprenticeship in September, which will be made up of a stimulating mix of study and work. You'll put your academic learning into practice as part of a team delivering live projects that keep our customers' people, assets and information safe.

As well as supporting your team to deliver designs, drawings and specifications on time, to cost and to the highest quality, you'll also help with the production of technical documentation and get experience undertaking surveys. And you'll be trained in everything from preparing accurate, timely and consistent project reports and communications to ensuring projects comply with health and safety procedures.

In addition, you'll learn wide-ranging skills. These will include the use of drawing and specification software, how to complete construction designs to NPSA (National Protective Security Authorisation (formerly CPNI) standards, and stakeholder management best practice. It's impactful, challenging work. And a chance to experience different cultures and construction standards as you help provide the most cost effective and sustainable approach to delivering projects of vital importance.

Throughout the apprenticeship you'll use the knowledge you've acquired in your practical work to support the success of your academic studies. The time you dedicate to your university work will change as you progress through the programme and will be a core part of how you develop. Learning modules will include:
