APPRENTICESHIPS IN FINANCE (TRANSACTIONAL)

Open to school-leavers, career-changers and anyone who wants to progress their interest in accounting, this programme is your first taste of a finance career with a twist. Because, as you learn everything from how to pay suppliers and reconcile statements, to how to administer credit cards and monitor spend – you'll be doing it for an organisation that works with government-level customers, worldwide.

 - Two GCSEs (or equivalent e.g. O levels) including Maths and English grades 9-4 (A*-C)
 - Numerical and analytical skills, and IT literacy
 - A genuine interest in finance and accounting
 - British citizenship, having lived in the UK for the last three years before the first day of the apprenticeship (aiming to start September 2022), and for at least five of the last ten years
 - To be at least 16 years old by 30 April 2022 so you can complete Security Check (SC) clearance before your start date
- Candidates will need to undergo Security Check (SC) clearance before joining.

As well as a competitive salary and fully-funded qualifications, you'll get hands-on experience in all sorts of teams. Accounts Receivable. Accounts Payable. Billing. Expenses. And as you learn how to balance the books – and how to balance your work and your studies – you'll be doing work that really counts. YOUR PROGRAMME

If your application is successful, your apprenticeship will involve attending college for one day a week, as you study towards your Level 2 AAT Foundation Certificate in Accounting. On other weekdays, you'll be placed in one of our accounting teams, where you'll take on real tasks and learn as you work.

APPRENTICESHIPS IN FINANCE (TRANSACTIONAL)

What kind of tasks could you do? Well, it might include transactional activities across any of the following:

- Accounts Payable: reconciling supplier accounts, paying invoices and reporting
- Billing: setting up and maintaining projects so they're ready for invoicing our customers
- Accounts Receivable: maintaining our general ledger, sending out invoices, allocating payment, chasing debt and reporting
- Corporate Credit Card and Expenses: administration of around 500 credit cards across the organisation, auditing expenditure and reporting.

Throughout the programme, you'll be assessed in a number of ways. You'll have regular visits at work where an assessor will take a look at your progress. They'll also support you to gather evidence through observations and professional discussions.



Finally, there's your college exams for the Level 2 AAT qualification. And of course, throughout the whole process, our team will be there to see you through, helping you manage your workload and achieve your potential.

APPRENTICESHIPS IN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Our Apprentices in IT spend 22 months learning to deliver and support successful and secure IT and mobile solutions for high-level UK Government departments, agencies and some international friendly governments. It's down to us to make sure their information and assets are protected, and you'll be part of that effort every day. Expect hands-on training on high-level projects, combined with academic studies that help you learn the theory behind the practice.

- Based at Hanslope Park, Milton Keynes
- 22-month programme with a potential full-time role at the end
- Combination of practical work and study
- Open to all ages, but you will need:
 - Minimum two GCSEs (or equivalent, e.g. O levels) in Maths and English, and ideally in a Computing/IT or a Science subject, at grade 9-4 (A*-C)
 - A genuine interest in computing and IT
 - British citizenship, having lived in the UK for the last three years before the first day of the apprenticeship, and for at least five of the last ten years
 - To be at least 16 years old by 30 April 2022 so you can complete Security Check (SC) clearance before your start date
- Candidates will need to undergo Security Check (SC) clearance before joining, and Developed Vetting (DV) clearance shortly after joining.

It means, at the end of it all, you'll be well on your way to an incredible professional career – and one that protects the UK's interests at home and overseas. So, if you're ready to find challenges you never knew were open to you, then your future just got bigger.

YOUR PROGRAMME

If successful, your apprenticeship with us will be based at Hanslope Park. After a short induction programme, you'll enrol with your training provider and begin learning for your knowledge modules.

You'll also begin a series of work placements – a chance to explore and get to grips with our various Technology and Operations teams and The UK National Authority for Counter-Eavesdropping (UK NACE), where you can put into practice the knowledge you've gained.

Studying towards your Level 3 Information Communication Technician apprenticeship qualification, you'll cover a range of topics including:

- Fundamentals of networks and networking
- Operating systems, hardware system architecture and devices
- Principles of Cloud and Cloud-based services and virtual computing
- Troubleshooting, fault diagnosis and problem solving

APPRENTICESHIPS IN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- Backup and storage solutions
- Secure remote computing
- ITIL Foundation.

After you've successfully completed the formal learning, we'll start looking at the kind of impact you want to make, tailoring your work placements towards the specific roles you could go into at the end of your programme. You'll also have on-going training in ITIL Service Management and a range of core Civil Service behaviours – all of which will aid you in supporting our high-level customer base.

You'll be assessed on your ability to demonstrate the following competencies gained through your work placements and interview:

- Communication
- IT security
- Data
- Workflow and task management
- Health and Safety
- Systems performance
- Remote infrastructure
- Problem solving, interpersonal skills and working effectively in a business environment.



In the last few months of your programme, you'll undertake your End Point Assessment, which includes a portfolio assessment, a practical project and a professional discussion with the assessor. Your practical project will be a real work-based project designed to benefit the business and demonstrate the knowledge, skills and behaviours you've picked up in the course of the apprenticeship – including how you use tools to problem-solve and troubleshoot non-routine problems.

COMPLETING YOUR APPRENTICESHIP - AND BEYOND

Complete the apprenticeship, and you'll gain your Level 3 Information Communication Technician apprenticeship qualification. But where to next? We'll do our best to find you a permanent position with us and you'll have a range of options to put the skills you've learnt to use. You could work in our Technology and Operations team, supporting our global customers' systems, such as in service management. Or, you could join our UK NACE teams, protecting systems and customers from technical espionage attack. You'll get a competitive salary, fully funded and well-respected training, and the chance to work with government-level customers on cutting-edge engineering projects that keep people safe and information secure, right around the world.

APPRENTICESHIPS IN TECHNICAL ENGINEERING

What kind of projects, exactly? Well, it could be installing a sophisticated CCTV system in a new embassy, or advanced intruder detection equipment in a particularly volatile region. Perhaps you'll prevent and detect technical eavesdropping attacks, or help design the next generation of security products. Whatever you do, you'll be protecting the UK's interests at home and overseas – so they're the kind of projects that just can't fail. With a mix of practical experience, formal study, and even the chance to work overseas, we think it's fair to say: your future just got bigger.

- Opportunity for overseas travel
- First nine months spent studying full-time, learning theoretical and practical elements of engineering
- Open to all ages, but you will need:
 - Minimum four GCSEs (or equivalent, e.g. O levels) at grade 9-4 (A*-C) in Maths, English, and either Science (preferably Physics
 - A genuine interest in engineering and technology
 - Ideally, some experience of using tools such as drills and saws'
 - British citizenship, having lived in the UK for the last three years before the first day of the apprenticeship, and for at least five of the last ten years
 - To be at least 16 years old by 30 April 2022 so you can complete Security Check (SC) clearance before your start date
- Candidates will need to undergo Security Check (SC) clearance before joining, and Developed Vetting (DV) clearance shortly after joining
- Candidates will need to undergo a colour blindness test if you reach assessment centre stage, since distinguishing between different colours of electrical wire will be a critical part of your role.

YOUR PROGRAMME FIRST YEAR

If successful, you'll start your apprenticeship with us and attend a local college on a fulltime basis. During college breaks, you'll work at our site at Hanslope Park, where you'll join teams across the organisation, helping you put your learning into action on live projects.

Once you finish your college course the following year, you'll return to Hanslope Park. This time, as well as beginning a programme of placements, you'll also complete a number of in-house courses, teaching you essential practical skills for your profession. These include basic telephony, technical security and radio transmission principles – skills you'll use to help us protect the nation's security every day.

At college, you'll study the following modules:

Development Knowledge

- Health and Safety
- Maths and Further Maths for technicians
- Mechanical principles
- Electrical and electronic engineering
- Engineering drawing
- Programmable logic controllers
- Principles and applications of electronic devices and circuits
- Electronic testing and measurements

Foundation Competence

- Wiring and testing electrical circuits and equipment
- Maintaining electronic equipment and systems
- Assembling, wiring and testing electrical panels and components mounted in enclosures

Development Competence

- Complying with statutory regulations and organisational safety requirements
- Using and interpreting engineering data and documentation
- Using and communicating technical information
- Working efficiently and effectively in advanced manufacturing and engineering

Functional Skills

• IT, Maths and English (exemptions possible depending on your GCSE grades)

SECOND YEAR

Your second year is where you'll start to really get to grips with the practical side of your role, helping us deliver projects in the UK – with the potential to travel overseas too. Through work placements around our business and relevant in-house training, you'll experience the sheer breadth of what we do.

Wherever you're placed though, one thing is guaranteed: you'll be a crucial part of an experienced team, learning new skills first-hand from our expert technical security colleagues. They'll support you to build on a range of abilities – how to install and maintain a wide variety of security systems, for instance – and you'll learn about the work of our countereavesdropping experts too.



It's an evidence-based qualification, so you'll need to document your practical experience too – and you'll have plenty of that to write about. You'll provide evidence through your written reports, and your assessor will track your progress and support you throughout the course.

THIRD AND FOURTH YEARS

In your third and fourth years, you'll continue to explore our organisation through a series of placements. You'll be moving towards professional status by now, building the skills and experience you need to pass the End Point Assessment. We'll support you at every step, and if you pass your apprenticeship, we'll help you look at your options when it comes to permanent positions within the organisation.

If you successfully complete the apprenticeship, you'll have gathered the following qualifications along the way:

Level 3 apprenticeship

- Level 2 Diploma in Advanced Manufacturing Engineering (Foundation Competence)
- Level 3 Diploma in Advanced Manufacturing Engineering – Technical Support (Development Competence)
- Level 3 Diploma or Extended Diploma in Advanced Manufacturing Engineering (Development Knowledge).

With all this under your belt, you'll have the opportunity to progress your membership with the Institution of Engineering and Technology, gaining respected professional status in your new industry. But where to next? Once you've completed your apprenticeship, you'll have a range of options to make your future bigger.

You could:

- Work in our Technical Services Centre, based in the UK but travelling overseas on a project by project basis to install a range of protective systems.
- Join one of our Regional Technical Support Services Teams, living and working overseas for up to four years. Based in one of our overseas hubs you'll travel across your region providing technical support to our customers
- Work as part of our National Authority for Counter-Eavesdropping (UK NACE) helping to prevent and detect technical eavesdropping attacks.
