- Level 4 apprenticeship, working towards an APM Project Management Qualification or International Project Management Association (IPMA) Level D
- Based at Hanslope Park, Milton Keynes, with the flexibility of hybrid working depending on business need

- Combination of practical work and study
- Open to all ages, but you will need:
 - Two GCSEs (or equivalent e.g. O levels) in Maths and English Language grades 9-4 (A*-C)
 - Communication skills, numeracy and IT literacy
 - A genuine interest in project management in the IT environment
 - British citizenship, having lived in the UK for the last three years before the first day of the apprenticeship (aiming to start September 2022), and for at least five of the last ten years
 - To be at least 16 years old by 30 April 2022 so you can complete Security Check (SC) clearance before your start date
- Candidates will need to undergo Developed Vetting (DV) clearance before joining.

Whether you're just leaving school, returning to work after a career break, or looking for a change of career, join this programme and you'll be doing a blend of training and practical work, helping us deliver successful IT solutions around the globe and taking part in real digital projects along the way. Your apprenticeship will conclude with you achieving a recognised qualification, accredited by the Association for Project Management. In other words, your future just got bigger.

YOUR PROGRAMME

If you're successful in your application, you'll start your apprenticeship at Hanslope Park in September. You'll experience a combination of classroom and on-the-job learning through a series of work placements inside our Chief Digital and Information Officer (CDIO) Group. Working on live projects alongside our project managers will build your experience and help you absorb the knowledge that will take you further.

Your training will be delivered in a variety of ways to ensure that you get the best learner experience. As well as a series of face-to-face workshops, you'll complete activities and challenges that are workbased or completed in your own time.

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There is also a two-day consolidating project management workshop. And every six to eight weeks, you'll have one-to-one sessions with a skills coach to get you thinking about how to apply the learning to workplace scenarios, allowing you to build up a useful portfolio of tools and techniques.

Once you've completed your qualification, your work placements will be tailored towards the potential role opportunities awaiting you at the end of your programme. There'll also be extra training to help you gain skills in Prince2 and Agile Project Management and core Civil Service competencies.

The key areas covered as part of this level 4 apprenticeship are:

- Principles of Project Management
- Communications and Stakeholder Management
- Business case, Budgets and Cost Control
- Planning, Risk and Quality
- Project Leadership.



As part of your APM Project Management Qualification or International Project Management Association (IPMA) Level D, you'll be assessed on the following competencies, gained through your work placements:

- Delivering projects and change at pace
- Harness the skills in making effective decisions for responsible project management
- Using and championing working together to ensure excellent project delivery.
